Plant Profile: The Genus Sedum

Sedum is a large genus of flowering plants in the family Crassulaceae, members of which are commonly known as stonecrops. It contains around 400 species of leaf succulents that are found throughout the Northern Hemisphere, varying from annual and creeping herbs to shrubs. The plants have water-storing leaves. The flowers usually have five petals, seldom four or six. There are typically twice as many stamens as petals.

A number of species, formerly classified as Sedum, are now a separate genus Hylotelephium.

The leaves of all stonecrops are edible. The leaves on one stonecrop common in Alaskan gardens, Sedum acre, contains high quantities of piperidine alkaloids which give it a sharp, peppery, acrid taste and make it somewhat toxic.

Sedum kamschaticum is one of the hardiest, and typically has yellow or orange flowers, though a pink variety is also being shared around. There is a nice variegated leaf form that does not self-sow as much as the plain species.

Most Sedums thrive on neglect and poor, dry, rocky soil.
