### **Codonopsis Mystery**

I have been growing a *Codonopsis* that Carmel Tysver gave me ten years ago. Her seed packet said *Codonopsis bhutanica*. From the few places I can find this name, it sounds like this is not what I have.

In <u>Dwarf Campanulas and Associated Genera</u>, by Graham Nicholls (2006) he mentions that the flowers are a "delicate purple color similar to typical *Fritillaria meleagris*." This is not what I have.

The flowers are a blue-washed white color with delicate purple markings inside (that you must take time to look into the bell-shaped flowers to see.) The plant is close to two feet tall – perhaps, because it is being crowded by the larger perennials in the garden. The leaves are a bit fuzzy and come out of the ground in a nice little mound. It is always a surprise in May that I still have it because each in April there is no sign what so ever that a plant ever grew in that spot.

The spot is sunny and usually mulched each winter by a Delphinium (growing about four feet away) that falls on it. The soil is loam and the plant is placed so that there is a slight (1-2-inch) rise to help with drainage.

I like any (maybe I better say "most") charming plant(s) that hangs around for a decade. Now that we have become friends, I would like to know its proper name. Does anyone else grow this and know its name?


## 2009 Garden Tours Anchorage



#### Jane & Bob Baldwin's Garden


A recently redesigned yard as Jane's fascination of primroses grew. You will see lots of primroses, misc. perennials, and veggies in containers.

Kathy has taken pains to place her special collection of plants to their best advantage. Everything is carefully labeled.



I sure am enjoying the early blooming bulbs of Chionodoxa, Scilla, Bulbocodium, Muscarri, and Narcissus.

Also, the early *Primulas* are a joy. The *Primula rose*a is usually the first to bloom in hot pink to chase away winter. Some of the *P. juliae* hybrids, 'Dorothy'-look-alikes, auriculas, and a dwarf *P. dentiucula* are great in perennial beds. *P. allonii* and *P. marginata* are as charming as can be in the rockier areas.

For the first time I have tried *Hepatica* with one now blooming. I have to say, that if I did not know to look for them, I would miss them in the heavy mulch under my big May Day tree.

### Plant Sale at ABG

ARGS will once again be selling plants at the ABG Fair on June 20th & 21st. Our location will be the same as last year—through the ABG Sales area and down the path toward the food venders—we are Spaces 5 & 6 on the left.
