From the President:

May is a significant month for gardeners. For those who missed it, May 3 is International Naked Gardening Day. It also happened that same day NARGS held a zoom meeting of all Chapter Chairs, mercifully appropriately garbed. There were 28 of us in attendance, and it was great to renew old friendships and put living faces on names.

NARGS is recruiting candidates for 3 new board members starting in 2025. Please contact the NARGS Board to nominate someone or to volunteer. They are also looking for a new treasurer and a new recording secretary beginning 2025, as well as a new webinar organizer. Contact Elizabeth Zander for more information.

For our chapter members who are not already NARGS members, NARGS annual dues are increasing by \$5 beginning July 1, 2024. NARGS is also adding options to pay for 2 year and 5 year memberships.

In 2023 NARGS had 1935 regular memberships, of which 1700 received the NARGS quarterly via mail. Two hundred memberships accessed the publication online. There were 120 household memberships, bringing the total number of people to 2052 members. This does not include 152 institutional memberships, mostly botanical gardens and one seed company.

NARGS is looking for Chapters to assist with the annual Seed Exchange. It is one of the favorite benefits to members. The huge effort has been broken into different sections that each require a dedicated group to complete. One request that impacts all of us is for each Chapter to train their own members in seed collecting, especially from rare and desirable plants from our own gardens, or arranging with members to collect from their gardens when seeds are ripe.

The New England Chapter is donating \$10k to the traveling speaker program, another one of the benefits of being a NARGS Chapter. We look forward to the 2025 roster of speakers, and hopefully Alaska can host a speaker.

Both NARGS and the Alaska Rock Garden Society are in a rebuilding phase, recovering from the impact of Covid-19. Locally, we are still impacted by the loss of Verna Pratt and more recently, Carmel Tysver. Our Chapter received an invitation from Carmel's husband, Neil, to a Memorial Garden Party for Carmel on Wednesday, May 22, 2024 at their home, 2030 Patriot Circle, Anchorage, AK 99515 from noon until 9pm. On a happier note, Plant Sales are just around the corner. The first will be at the Alaska Botanical Garden in Anchorage on Saturday, May 11, 2024. Plant drop off can be arranged with Will Criner at ABG on Friday afternoon, or very early on Saturday. The sale opens at 9am for ABG members, and runs from 10am-4pm for the general public. We will be set up on the path and lawn next to the rock garden as in years past. We will need a good number of volunteers to help set up and run the sale. Our second plant sale will be on Memorial Weekend, Saturday, May 25, 2024 at Snowfire Gardens in Wasilla. The details and need for volunteers is similar to the earlier sale.



Plant Profile by Florene Carney

Gentiana sino-ornata, commonly called showy Chinese gentian, is a species of flowering plant in the family Gentianaceae, native to western China and Tibet. Interestingly, the Latin species name also translates as 'showy Chinese'. It is a perennial with trailing stems to 20cm in length, bearing narrow leaves and solitary, terminal, rich blue, funnel-shaped flowers up to 6cm in length, with white stripes within.

This plant is an autumn classic; reliable and easy to grow in a border, wall or container, and a winner of the Royal Horticultural Society Award of Garden Merit (RHS AGM). It, however, does not like alkaline soil!

Position: Full sun, partial shade

Soil: Almost any soil, grows well in South Central Alaska (but doesn't like alkaline soils or water)

Flowers: Late August (here in South Central Alaska, flowers in September)

Other features: Grows well in South central Alaska gardens

Hardiness: H 3 to 5 - Hardy in most places throughout the UK even in severe winters (-15 to -10°

C), Appears to be Fully hardy

Habit: Trailing

Foliage: Deciduous

Height: 5 - 15 cm (0.15 - 0.5 ft)

Spread: 10 - 45 cm (0.3 - 1.5 ft)

Time to full growth: 2 to 5 years

Plant type: Herbaceous Perennial
